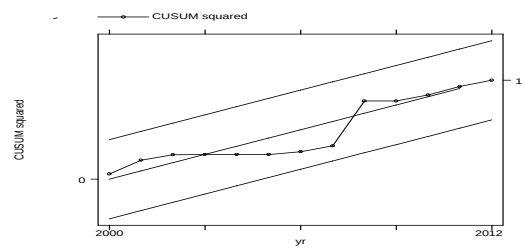
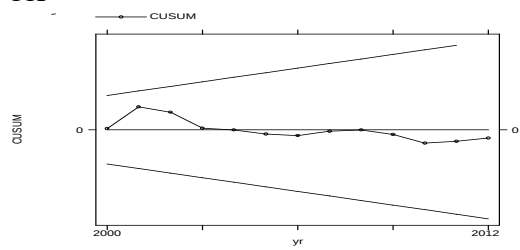

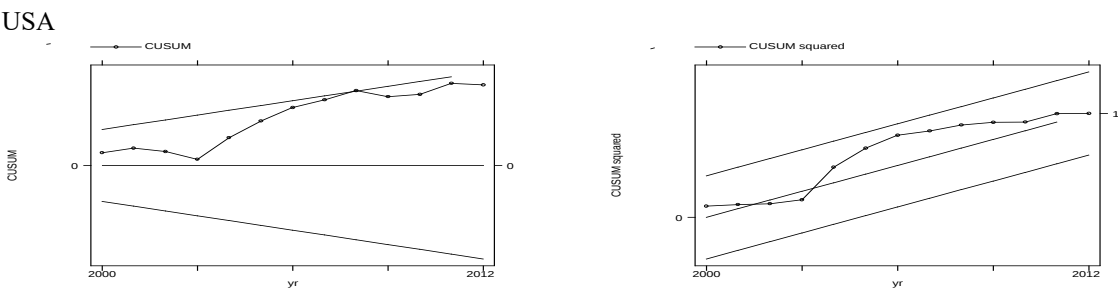


Figure S1. CUSUM and CUSUMQ tests for structural breaks
