Figure S1. Histogram of the area of the 226 significant (p < 0.01 in the CMK test) classes. The Y axis shows the area of each class in km². The captions for each class in the X axis (and label) indicate the significance of the five shape parameters. Significant positive trends are marked with a "+" sign, significant negative trends with a "-" sign, and insignificant trends with a 0. Reading from the bottom up, the symbols indicate the significance of trends in Amplitude 0, Amplitude 1, Phase 1, Amplitude 2 and Phase 2. Thus the left-most bar (Class 1) has a significant positive trend in Amplitude 0 and no significant trend in the other four parameters.



