

Supplementary Figure 1. Body weight and food intake of rats on a SeMet-supplemented diet. Male Wistar rats (100-125 g) were housed two rats per cage and randomly assigned into groups receiving either normal chow (control, dashed line) or normal chow supplemented with SeMet (2 mg kg⁻¹, solid line) ad libitum for 8 weeks, with the (A) body weight of rats and (B) food consumption recorded at the end of each week. No significant difference between control and SeMet-supplemented group as determined by two-way ANOVA with Holm-Sidak post-hoc testing.
