

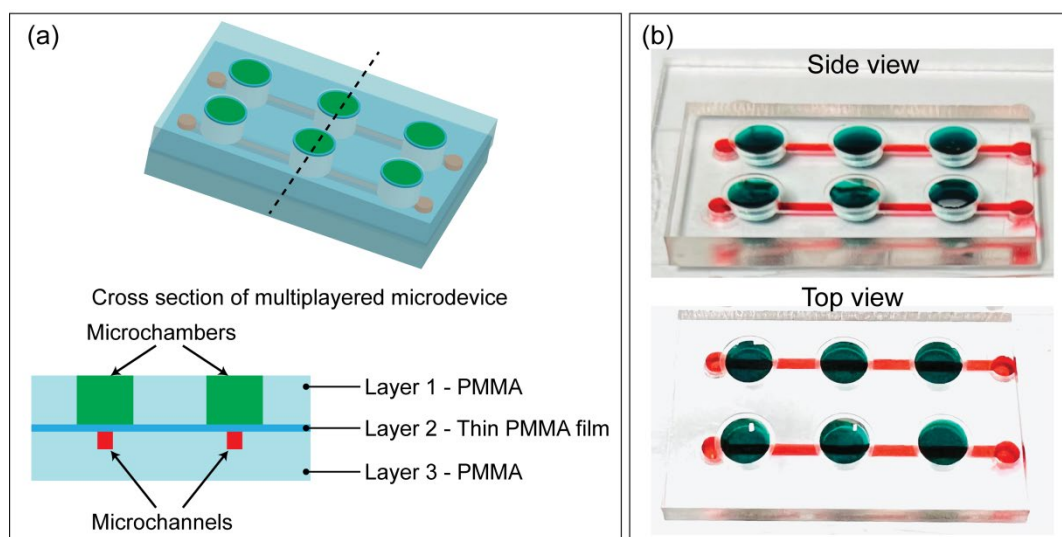
# Pressure-free assembling of poly(methyl methacrylate) microdevices via microwave-assisted solvent bonding and its biomedical applications

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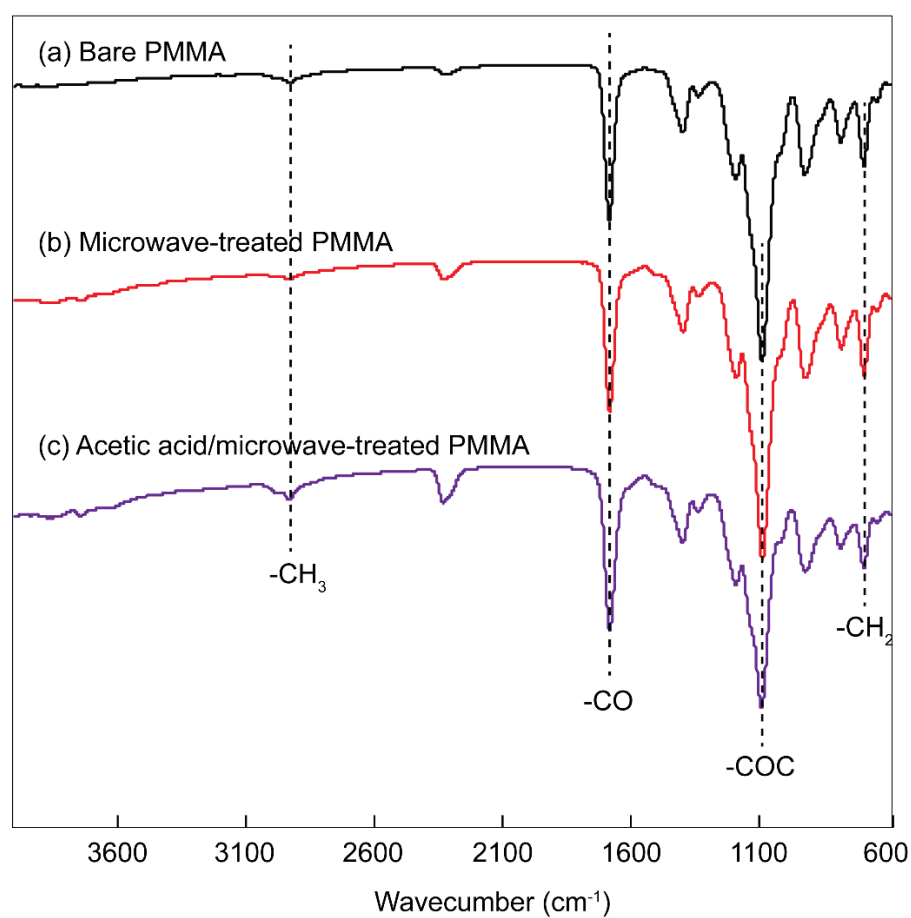
