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


Figure S1. The antibiotic susceptibility tests by disk diffusion method. (a): Antimicrobial activity against *E.coli ATCC* 25922, (b): Antimicrobial activity against *P.aeruginosa ATCC* 27863, (c): Antimicrobial activity against MDR clinical *A.baumannii* no.7, (d): Antimicrobial activity against MDR clinical *P.aeruginosa* no 4. The strains were assessed against the following antibiotic disks: PIP(piperacillin, 100 μg), CAZ(ceftazidime ,30μg), CPM(cefepime, 30μg), IMI (imipenem, 10μg), GM (gentamicin, 10μg), AK(amikacin, 30μg), T(tetracycline, 30μg), CIP(ciprofloxacin, 5μg) and COL (colistin. 5 μg).

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
