Absorption spectra (ABS) and fluorescence quantum yields at different excitation wavelengths for (Upper) a comparison between the as-supplied MilliporeSigma sample solution and EDA-CDots, where the yields are normalized against the values at 400 nm excitation of 5.9% for the former and 24% for the latter; and (Lower) a comparison between the two samples from processing the CA – FA mixture at 160 °C for 1 h and at 300 °C for 2 h, where the yields are normalized against the values at 400 nm excitation of 20% for the former and 14% for the latter.
