As dissemination mostly occurs through the blood, the detection and characterisation of circulating tumour cells (CTCs) have become promising areas of oncology research. In the last decade, studies on CTCs have provided important insights into their role in cancer dissemination and, as one of the pillars constituting "liquid biopsy", their potential utility as a clinically useful biomarker for timely disease detection, treatment response and disease progression evaluation, elucidation of disease mechanisms, and therapeutic target identification for drug development.
