In a competitive context, the knowledge and manipulation of psychological variables such as attention, self-confidence, stress control, anxiety, motivation, cohesion, self-control or emotional self-regulation, moods and interpersonal skills can influence the adherence and health of the athlete.

Even the practice of sport can generate fears of failure and feelings of shame, creating a degree of insecurity, anxiety or stress and avoidance behaviors in athletes, which can affect well-being, interpersonal behavior and sport adherence

Therefore, the physical and psychological well-being of athletes depends mainly on the social environments in which sport is practiced, i.e., in relation to the significant agents in the environment.
