The recent market release of monoclonal antibodies (MAbs), specifically targeting the calcitonin gene-related peptide (CGRP) or its receptor (anti-CGRP MAbs), based on the results of clinical trials and real-life data, appeared as a promising preventative option in both episodic and chronic migraine patients with a much higher efficacy/tolerability ratio, compared to the already available oral and injectable prophylactic treatment of armamentarium. In addition, anti-CGRP MAbs can be used with some degree of success as preventives in other headache disorders

The scope of this Special Issue is to summarize our existing knowledge on the pros and cons of modern therapies for headache disorders, to examine open clinical and pathogenetic issues and to explore future perspectives for future research to pursue.
