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Message from the Guest Editors

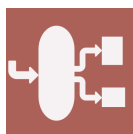
Dear Colleagues,

The emergence of machine learning is revolutionizing computational chemistry and materials science, providing novel methods to address these challenges in modeling excited-state dynamics.
