



Supplementary Figure S1: Map of the study area showing the areas of heath that have been cleared (in black), the areas of heath currently protected in National Parks (in green), and the remaining areas of heath (in red) tenured privately, or in lower levels of protection. The large area of National Park at the top of the map is the Coolooloo section of the Great Sandy National Park. The major population centers are in the mid to southern coastal sections of the map.
