


Figure S1. Oleacein chemical structure




Figure S2. ^1H NMR of (-)-Oleacein in deuterated chloroform.




Figure S3. ^{13}C NMR (bottom) and DEPT-135 (superior) of (-)-Oleacein in deuterated chloroform.
