


Figure S1. Optimization graphs of the simulated unit cells with different geometries. Phase (a) and amplitude (b) responses when GSST is in A-state. Phase (c) and amplitude (d) responses when GSST is in C-state. The same symbol indicates the same i in Table S1. It can be inferred that for a given phase shift at A-state, six kinds of meta atoms can be chosen that can fully cover $0\text{--}2\pi$ at C-state.






Figure S3. The schematic illustration for the multi-focus metalens.




Figure S4. The schematic illustration for the multistate vortex beam generator.




Figure S5. A feasible fabrication process for the designed sample.


