Many crops and crop cultivars show allelopathic properties, such as wheat, barley, rice, rye, buckwheat, pea, velvetbean, fava bean, etc. The use of cover crops with allelopathic activities also results in less weed and soil erosion and lessens the need for nitrogen fertilizers.
