The application of amino acids in poultry diets has a history that reaches back more than 70 years. The original reason for this was to reduce dietary crude protein content, which is still an aim. Due to a variety of reasons, numerous countries are making efforts to reduce the dependence on imported protein sources and reduce the environmental impacts of animal farming. However, this goal can be achieved with the knowledge of digestible amino acid requirement of birds and the content of feedstuffs, and the effect of low-CP diets on that. The industrial production of various amino acids has led to much wider opportunities to increase our knowledge. Moreover, not has only the effect of production been considered, but our information is increasing regarding to the physiological effects of amino acids. The introduction of and research into in ovo feeding has also opened new horizons.
