Message from the Collection Editor

A precise knowledge of animal behavior is a prerequisite for assessing animal welfare. Despite increasing interest in this field in recent years, there are still many questions to be answered, especially with regard to pigs' behavior and welfare. Current problems such as tail biting or piglet crushing still have to be solved, and the impact of the pigs' environment on their behavior and welfare should be further elucidated. Therefore, more research on pig behavior in different environments is necessary, and the relation of behavioral aspects to stress and welfare needs to be explored. There may be ways to positively influence pigs' behavior and welfare, for example, by new methods of environmental enrichment, using also the pigs' cognitive abilities. This Collection focuses on new insights into the behavior and welfare of pigs depending on their environment. Animals' housing and social environment can be considered. Research papers on domestic pigs in intensive livestock systems are as welcome as studies from free-ranging or other alternative systems. We also encouraged research articles on wild boars' behavior and welfare.
