Dear Colleagues,

Animal pathogens have drawn attention in the fields of both the livestock and public health for their impacts worldwide on socio-economics, food safety and security, and human health.

Diagnostics represents an important step for correct pathogen detection, the successful treatment of animal infection, and management in clinic, farm and field conditions. Current techniques employed to diagnose pathogens include classical methods and molecular techniques. However, there is a strong interest in developing new, swift, point-of-care biosensing systems for the early detection of animal diseases with high sensitivity and specificity, particularly in field analysis.

The aim of this Special Issue is to provide a collection of articles detailing the latest knowledge on infectious diseases in animals. We encourage the submission of original research or review papers from different areas, including the development of rapid screening methods for bacteriological and virological diagnostics or test kits for the diagnosis of mycological infections.
