Studies on the major viral infections of poultry, such as infectious bronchitis (Avian coronavirus), turkey rhinotracheitis and swollen head Syndrome (Avian metapneumovirus), infectious laryngotracheitis (Gallid alphaherpesvirus 1), Newcastle disease (Avian orthoavulavirus 1), avian influenza (Influenza A virus), infectious bursal disease (Infectious bursal disease virus), chicken infectious anemia (Chicken anemia virus), Marek's disease (Gallid alphaherpesvirus 2), and turkey hemorrhagic enteritis (Turkey siadenovirus A), are welcomed. Minor, or newly observed, respiratory and immunosuppressive viral conditions will be also considered. Additional topics may include the interaction between different pathogens in experimental or field conditions or the observation of well-known agents in unusual host species.
