### Message from the Guest Editors

Foodborne pathogens continue to be a major public health issue, especially due to the increasing antimicrobial resistance in pathogens commonly transmitted by food. Surveillance of antimicrobial resistance bacteria permits the early detection of resistant strains, the identification of outbreaks and the implementation of public health measures. Surveillance data are also important for informing clinical therapy decisions.

The present Special Issue aims to address the variability of surveillance methods used (in humans and animals) and to summarize the most recent evidence on the evolution of antimicrobial resistance of foodborne pathogens, such as *Campylobacter* spp., *Salmonella* spp., *Yersinia enterocolitica*, pathogenic *Escherichia coli* and *Listeria monocytogenes*. Finally, papers written under the prism of One Health, combining data from different data sources (human, food and animal), are welcomed, in order to have a more holistic view of the resistance of foodborne pathogens in different parts of the food chain. If serious foodborne outbreaks occur during the preparation period of this Special Issue, they are also welcomed to be presented.
