Carbapenem-resistant Gram-negative bacteria are listed by the World Health Organization as pathogens with critical priority for the development of new drugs. The surveillance of antimicrobial resistance is critical to providing early warning of emerging problems, monitoring changing patterns of resistance, and targeting and evaluating prevention and control measures.
