Message from the Guest Editors

The ample exploit of antibiotics in the management of bacterial infections has led to the emergence and multiplication of resistant bacterial strains. Infections due to multidrug-resistant pathogens are routinely complicated by virulence factors coupled with a relatively limited choice of antimicrobial agents. Thus, it is extremely important to find novel antimicrobials or new techniques that are effective in treating infectious diseases caused by drug-resistant microorganisms. Furthermore, microorganisms have a natural capacity to attach to surfaces, multiply, embed themselves in a slimy matrix, and form biofilms, making their eradication more difficult and complex. This Special Issue aims to publish high-quality manuscripts evaluating the antibacterial properties of plant extracts and essential oils together with their chemical characterization, bioassay-guided fractionation, isolation, and/or structure elucidation.
