# Antioxidant Properties in Novel Feed Ingredients for Fish

## Message from the Guest Editor

In the future, aquaculture will be the most reliable seafood source to meet the increasing protein requirements. However, concerns are rising regarding its environmental impact due to the reliance of aquaculture feeds on fishery ingredients. Alternative ingredients, such as insect meal, plant feedstuffs, processed animal proteins and single-cell microorganisms, are increasingly being used nowadays. An improved oxidative status will allow for increasing fish welfare even when produced intensively, leading to a more sustainable production pattern.

This Special Issue welcomes contributions on these topics as literature reviews, original research manuscripts or short communications. The topics of interest include manuscripts on the use of alternative feed ingredients, such as insect meal, medicinal plants or any other ingredient which potentially presents antioxidant properties in fish.
