Over the last few decades, the increase in the computational resources, coupled to the popularity of competitive quantum mechanics alternatives (particularly DFT), has promoted a widespread penetration of quantum mechanics calculations in a variety of fields targeting the reactivity of molecules. - New or improved quantum mechanical methods;
- Software programs featuring QM codes.
