The function, as well as the community structure of the plant inhabitant, may be changeable and is shaped by climatic conditions and agricultural management. It has been shown that the plant microbiome plays a vital role in host growth and fitness. as well as may alleviate the abiotic and biotic stresses effects. Due to the importance of plant-associated fungi and bacteria in host adaptation, there is a need to understand how the microbiome responds to environmental changes and thus shape the plant's response to changing environmental conditions.
