Formulas, systems, and methods are not new to music production. The Brill Building songwriters, Motown, The Spice Girls and Boy Band equivalents, and more recently, K-Pop have all used carefully constructed systems to churn out their hits. However, until recently, taking the human actors out of these systems and handing creative control over to computers—for either music creation or music production—was unthinkable.
