Lithium-ion batteries are widely used in electric vehicles (EVs) and the energy storage industry due to their high energy density and long cycle life. As their price decreases, lithium-ion batteries will continue to be used in the future. Battery management systems (BMSs) are the key component to ensure the stable and reliable operation of battery systems. They monitor battery operation data, estimate the battery state of charge (SOC) and state of health (SOH), conduct battery balance, manage thermal systems and perform fault diagnosis.
