We are pleased to invite you to contribute to this Special Issue. Suicide remains a leading cause of death worldwide among adolescents and young adults. Suicide prevention requires a superior understanding of the complex factors that can identify suicidal youth. For this Special Issue, we welcome innovative psychometric and statistical modeling studies that utilize scores on valid measures to enhance our understanding of the relationships among internalizing disorders. Importantly, we encourage submissions across disciplines that examine the relationships between internalizing disorders, including suicidal thoughts, mood disorders, emotions, and at-risk behaviors in youth. Research areas may include, but are not limited to, the following:

- Network models of internalizing disorders in clinical/non-clinical samples.
- Factors that understand fluctuations in internalizing disorders or predict transitions from internalizing conditions to externalizing disorders.
- Innovative modeling strategies for developing and validating scores on tools for screening/assessing internalizing disorders for youth and young adults.
