The increasing frequency and complexity of migration phenomena have brought the concept of community resilience to the forefront of discussions on how societies can respond effectively to the challenges of migration. Migration is often associated with significant hardships for both migrants and host communities. including acculturative stress, language barriers, discrimination, and economic and social instability, which can profoundly impact the psychological and social wellbeing of individuals and communities. Recent research emphasizes the importance of communitylevel protective factors that can mitigate the negative effects of migration. This Special Issue invites contributions that explore the multiple aspects of community resilience in migration contexts, from how community resilience can be fostered through social, economic, and cultural initiatives to how these efforts can lead to more inclusive and resilient societies. Studies that offer practical insights, draw on empirical data, or provide theoretical advances in understanding community resilience in migration contexts are particularly welcome.
