Romantic relationships are a hallmark of adolescence and young adulthood. Research widely showed associations between high-quality romantic relationships and multiple aspects of individual development and well-being. The purpose of this Special Issue is to collect recent studies carried out with samples of adolescents and young adults that, going beyond epidemiological and descriptive aspects, will allow for a more in-depth exploration and understanding of causes, risk factors and protective factors that may influence or determine the occurrence of certain risky situations, as well as moderate or contain the likelihood that these risky situations may take place. In addition, this Special Issue has the purpose of presenting programs or projects designed to work on the risk behaviors associated with romantic relationships in terms of both prevention and intervention.
