This Special Issue focuses on approaches to cultivating mental health and psychological well-being amongst migrant communities, with a particular focus on those impacted by experiences of forced displacement (e.g., refugees, asylum seekers) and other forms of collective trauma. This Special Issue is interested in communitybased (and community-led) approaches to wellness and submissions may include the following topics: a) evaluations of community-led mental health promotion programs (e.g., peer support groups or mental health literacy campaigns); b) the adaptation of existing evidence-based mental health interventions for use with newcomer communities; c) research investigating the role of religious and ethno-cultural organizations in cultivating health and well-being amongst newcomer communities; d) health services research with a focus on mental health promotion amongst newcomer communities; and e) policy research investigating mental health drivers for newcomer communities.
