Endometriosis is a chronic, inflammatory, benign disease commonly found in women of reproductive age. However, it can affect people of all ages and has even been found in men and animals, as well as in fetuses. Unfortunately, it tends to take 7–10 years for the diagnosis of endometriosis to be made. This Special Issue provides an excellent opportunity for a thorough analysis of the pathophysiology of the disease, the signs and symptoms, and the type of pain. Categories of endometriosis can be identified, and conservative and surgical techniques can be provided. An important research area is the pain associated with endometriosis. One of the causative factors of the pain experienced in endometriosis is inflammation. The suppression of inflammatory mediators by inhibiting their synthesis might offer novel and effective treatments for the inflammatory pain experienced in endometriosis. This Special Issue welcomes new and innovative original studies and detailed reviews in this field.
