Message from the Guest Editor

Hepatocellular carcinoma represents a rapidly growing cause of worldwide cancer morbidity and mortality. Potential curative treatments for HCC have been limited to transplantation and surgical resection. However, emerging clinical, translational, and basic science data have shown promising results in identifying new treatment modalities such as neoadjuvant and adjuvant immunotherapy. In addition, new locoregional techniques such as histotripsy also open up new possibilities in the management of HCC for patients with tumors not amenable to resection or liver transplantation. This Special Issue seeks to highlight the advances in the basic science of HCC and in clinical treatment, and we welcome submissions that offer novel insights into HCC's etiology, progression, and potential treatment.
