Message from the Guest Editor

Chronic diseases, often called noncommunicable diseases (NCDs), using the origins and development of these diseases, mechanistic research contributes not only to our understanding of these diseases but also drives further development of current preventative strategies, therapies, and future cures. The range of topics considered for this Special Issue can include: 1) new insights into the nature of these diseases, 2) effective preventative strategies considering pathogenesis, 3) current therapeutic approaches, and 4) the direction of future cures for these chronic diseases. Even when a paper focuses on a single disease (e.g., asthma, diabetes, inflammatory bowel, Alzheimer's disease, or a cardiovascular condition), we encourage authors to discuss the potential utility of their findings to additional related NCDs.
