Message from the Guest Editor

Wearable motion sensors have been used in human motion analysis since 1990s. They are highly transportable and do not require stationary units like receivers and cameras, and therefore can be used outside the traditional biomechanics laboratory equipped with force plates and motion capture system with multiple cameras. These devices allow the measurement of human gait and motion to be conducted anywhere, and can further allow practical applications in training and rehabilitation monitoring. This Special Issue seeks papers related to the development and use of wearable sensors for human gait and motion analysis.
