Exosomes in Tumor

Message from the Guest Editors

Exosomes, small vesicles released by various cells, including cancer cells, carry a diverse cargo of proteins, lipids, and nucleic acids, which can be transferred to recipient cells, thereby influencing their behavior. They play a pivotal role in shaping the tumor microenvironment by contributing to promoting tumor-stroma crosstalk, angiogenesis, immune modulation, tumor-induced immune suppression, tumor growth, invasion, metastasis, and drug resistance. Exosomes also hold immense diagnostic potential, serving as non-invasive biomarkers for cancer detection, prognosis, and treatment response assessment through liquid biopsies. Targeting exosomal cargo to inhibit tumor growth and modulate tumor-promoting signals shows potential for the development of novel anti-cancer strategies. Additionally, engineered exosomes offer a promising platform for targeted cancer therapy, delivering therapeutic agents to tumor cells while minimizing off-target effects and enhancing treatment efficacy. This Special Issue welcomes original research articles and timely reviews on all aspects of exosomes that will open up new research avenues for precision oncology.
