FAK is now appreciated as a key biosensory signaling hub that integrates extracellular matrix cues with transcriptional programs. Copy number gains in the PTK2 gene and subsequent increased FAK expression are associated with aggressive cancer phenotypes. This Special Issue will focus on emerging roles for FAK signaling as a reprogrammer of the tumor microenvironment, with key roles governing matrix production, immunoregulation, and stem-like cellular phenotypes.
