Breast cancer in the context of pregnancy is a rare but increasingly recognized scenario that poses unique diagnostic, therapeutic, and psychosocial challenges. However, growing evidence indicates that breast cancers diagnosed in the years following childbirth have distinct biological features and prognoses.

This Special Issue will explore the complex interplay between breast cancer and pregnancy in all its forms. For this Special Issue, original research articles, reviews, and systematic reviews are welcome. Topics may include (but are not limited to) clinical management during pregnancy and postpartum; systemic, surgical, and radiologic strategies; maternal and fetal outcomes; pregnancy after breast cancer; fertility preservation and oncofertility; high-risk genetic mutations; epidemiology and risk factors; biological mechanisms; and ethical, psychosocial, and public health perspectives.
