Message from the Guest Editor

Transarterial chemoembolization has been used for many years for the treatment of hepatocellular carcinoma and it is one of the most used treatments in the world. Recent worldwide data show that TACE is associated with 40% of objective response after the first cure including 14% of complete response. However, there is a lack of strong scientific evidence for efficacy and safety due to lack of large recent randomized control trials. There is still a debate on the real place of TACE in the HCC treatment arsenal. Immunotherapy in HCC opens new ways and opportunities. This Special Issue will highlight the place of TACE in this new area.
