State of the Art and Perspectives in Lung Cancer Immunotherapy

Message from the Guest Editor

Immune checkpoint inhibitors have drastically changed therapeutic strategies in lung cancer. However, novel composite and dynamic biomarkers of immune evasion are needed to develop tailored strategies. Indeed, a global approach integrating both immune and tumor-related parameters is crucial. Numerous ongoing clinical trials are evaluating novel immune-based combinations in order to overcome resistance pathways and reshape the immunotherapy landscape. However, an understanding of cellular and molecular mechanisms of resistance is essential to guide personalized immunotherapies. This Special Issue will include original articles and reviews that investigate signaling pathways of resistance to immunotherapy and new therapeutic strategies for lung cancer. We encourage contributions that explore the cellular and molecular aspects of resistance or recent advances including adoptive cell therapy and therapeutic cancer vaccines. Preclinical and clinical studies investigating the impact of the tumor microenvironment on the immunological response are also warranted.
