Mast Cells in Immunity and Inflammation

Message from the Guest Editors

Mast cells are widely distributed in connective tissues, express the high affinity receptor for the Fc portion of the IgE antibody (FceRI) on their surface, and can secrete a plethora of mediators and cytokines. Mast cells can promote host resistance to a plethora of infectious agents but may also contribute to dysregulation of the inflammatory process both in response to infection and in autoimmune diseases. Mast cells can be considered sensors and regulators of immunity and inflammation and may act as a double-edged sword. Therefore, strategies aimed at modulating mast cell response are crucial.

This Special Issue offers an Open Access forum that aims to create a collection of original research and review articles addressing the important field of mast cell regulation of immunity and inflammation. Suggested potential topics may be:

Mast cell function in host response to infection and in autoimmunity, regulation of immune response and inflammation, modulation of mast cell response, cellular and molecular mechanisms mediating mast cell regulation, and the role of mast cells in SARS-CoV-2.
