Research shows that a high-risk birth significantly increases the risk for child developmental concerns across domains of cognition, behaviour, socioemotional regulation, neurodevelopment, and academic outcomes. The all-encompassing environment arising from high-risk births undoubtedly has the potential to bidirectionally impact on long-term child development. Despite this, empirical investigations on the impact of the family system on the child is limited. Therefore, to broaden the scope of this research area, this Special Issue will bring together international expertise, highlighting areas of both challenges and strengths for child development after high-risk birth.
