It is widely defined as repeated aggressive behaviour intended to harm another individual or group, marked by a power imbalance between the perpetrator and the victim. School bullying has long been a pervasive issue, affecting children and adolescents across multiple mental health domains, inflicting social, psychological, and educational consequences for those involved.

Research focusing on other clearly related subtopics may be considered. We also welcome studies looking at either traditional bullying, cyberbullying, or other related forms of online and offline aggression.
