Neurological Diseases in Children and Adolescent

Message from the Guest Editor

A growing number of requests for neurological consultation in children and adolescent was observed in the decade before Sars-COV2 pandemics within a wide context, including acute settings (neurological emergencies are life-threatening in up to one third of patients) and chronic/degenerative disorders (increasing knowledge regarding the genetic basis and pathophysiology of several diseases opened new perspectives for the optimization of diagnostic work-ups and for the elaboration of novel “precision medicine” therapeutic strategies). This topic aimed to explore the real-world frontiers for clinicians and neuroscience researchers involved in the study and management of children and adolescent with neurological diseases. Original articles, brief communications, narrative or systematic review articles and case-based reviews (single case reports without a detailed associated review of the literature about the topic of the paper will not be accepted) in all fields of paediatric neurosciences will be taken into consideration for publication.
