Message from the Guest Editor

Paediatric dermatopathology covers a wide range of disorders including genodermatoses, cutaneous and sub-cutaneous tumours, and inflammatory disorders. Four years ago, we launched a first Special Issue dedicated to paediatric dermatopathology. It included topics such as paediatric panniculitis, auto-inflammatory disorders, paediatric melanoma, tuberous sclerosis complex, spindle-cell neoplasms, congenital cysts, and venous malformations and attracted many readers. The success of this first Special Issue confirmed that dermatopathologists benefitted from having access to a comprehensive, up-to-date resource on key subjects in dermatopathology, and so we decided to publish another Special Issue in this field. This new Issue will endeavour to complement the first, with a wide range of topics in paediatric dermatopathology, focusing on conditions that have not been addressed up until now in this journal, such as paediatric vasculitis, paediatric cutaneous lymphoma, and other haematological disorders, paediatric tumours, desmosomal genodermatoses, keratinopathic ichthyoses, paediatric melanonychia, some disorders of mucous membranes in children, and paediatric cutaneous mucinosis.

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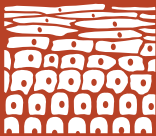


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About the Journal
