Message from the Guest Editor

Cancers of the female genital organs are known explicitly as gynecological cancers, including tuboovarian cancer, uterine and cervical cancer, vaginal cancer, and vulvar cancer. The optimal screening methods for gynecologic cancers are still being investigated. Cervical cancer is the only gynecologic malignancy for which a screening modality is widely accepted and recommended to all women. Surgery is the primary treatment for several gynecological cancer patients. However, further treatment (adjuvant therapy and/or maintenance therapy) is required in some patients. This Special Issue will publish reviews and original papers on detection, prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of gynecologic malignancies.
