Message from the Guest Editor

With the advent of new disciplines and technologies providing high-quality, high-value care for patients, we are entering a new era in emergency and hospital medicine. However, challenges to generalists persist because both emergency care and hospitalizations involve managing complex patients in diverse situations. Clinical diagnosis and management of these patients require a comprehensive process design, quality improvement, competent training and skills, and the integration of the entire healthcare system. Although most randomized clinical trials enroll participants in emergency and inpatient settings, the primary outcomes are usually tracked outside the hospital. More research is needed to improve evidence-based practice in the field of emergency and hospital medicine so that we can improve the quality of care in the hospital. Highlighting key interventions during the early admission timeframe is necessary. Outcomes assessed during hospitalization or shortly after discharge are crucial, alongside long-term outcomes. We welcome research papers on any aspect related to this theme, including diagnosis, treatment, management, decision making, transitional care, and palliative care.
