Endometriosis, Adenomyosis and Gynecologic Cancer: Diagnosis and Management

Message from the Guest Editor

Endometriosis and adenomyosis are complex diseases with economic implications that cause abdominal and pelvic pain, infertility, dyspareunia and decreased quality of life. The diagnosis and management of endometriosis and adenomyosis and the determination of their malignancy require tools with high sensitivity and specificity. New sensitive, specific, accurate and reliable technologies that can be implemented using high-throughput mechanisms are essential. For this Special Issue, we encourage authors to contribute manuscripts that describe the current state of research on endometriosis and adenomyosis and predictive factors for their malignancy, with a focus on similarities in the patterns of behavior and pathogenesis of endometriosis and cancers. Additionally, studies of clinical, molecular, imaging, genetic and histopathological markers for better prediction of malignant transformation in endometriosis or adenomyosis, as well as discussions of how those markers can be used in clinical practice and in therapy, are encouraged.
