Message from the Guest Editors

The aim of this Special Issue is to provide an overview of this lively field of research by collecting contributions covering various aspects related to this topic, starting from the main question of consciousness diagnosis that can be investigated through low-cost and easy-toimplement measures of consciousness, or by the use of more sophisticated instrumental techniques. Multimodal approaches validated by multicenter studies will be considered with more emphasis. Contributions may also be related to other factors that might interfere with prognosis from observational studies down to clinical trials and applications. Submissions on neurorehabilitation pathways and the use of innovative rehabilitation strategies for patients with DoCs will also be appreciated. Finally, reviews or papers concerning the ethical implications of the treatment of patients with DoCs will be considered.
