Diagnosis and Management of Sarcoidosis

Message from the Guest Editor

Sarcoidosis is a granulomatous disorder characterized mostly by the involvement of lungs and intrathoracic lymph nodes from noncaseating and nonnecrotizing granulomas. However, no organ or tissue is spared, and broad areas such as the gastrointestinal, genitourinary, and nervous system can be affected. Diagnosis is often difficult, in particular when the disease is isolated and affects atypical sites (here the biopsy is often mandatory to reach the diagnosis). A correct therapeutic approach is based on corticosteroid drugs in symptomatic patients with significant lung or extrapulmonary disease, while more aggressive immunosuppressive treatment should be reserved for refractory or complex cases. This Issue would like to report the latest research on the diagnosis and management of sarcoidosis, and authors are invited to submit their articles (original research or review papers) for consideration.
