Message from the Guest Editors

We are pleased to invite you to submit manuscripts to a MDPI Drones Special Issue on "Unmanned Aerial Vehicles in Atmospheric Research". The everexpanding range of drone applications observed in recent years is also taking place in the field of atmospheric research. The increasing availability and reliability of these platforms opens new opportunities in the study of various processes occurring in the planetary boundary layer and at the interface between the Earth's surface and atmosphere. These studies allow us to fill the gap between surface measurements and methods, enabling the observation of atmospheric profiles at higher altitudes (aircraft, LIDAR, satellite observations). Additionally, the acquisition of surface images from relatively low altitudes allows us to drastically increase the resolution of these images and develop downscaling methods for satellite products. On the other hand, the availability of a variety of low-cost sensors that allow the measurement of trace gas or pollutant concentrations opens opportunities for the development of methods to identify the emission sources of these components and estimate their emission rates.
